## LOCAL TEEN WINS COUNTRY SHOWDOWN

The 31st Annual Texaco Country Showdown was held at the Sheridan County Fair with the local competition concluding on July 26.

Westby teen Logan Olson was declared this year's winner. This is

America's largest country music talent search and radio promotion. The win marks completion of the first step in the prestigious national contest.

Logan is 16 years old and a junior at Westby High. He enjoys hunting, playing basketball and singing. His combination of musical talent, stage presence, charisma, musicianship and originality caught the attention of the judges.



Logan performed two songs for the competition the first was written by him entitled "Northeast Montana" and he concluded with "Wagon Wheel" by Old Crow Medicine Show. On August 3, 2012, at Spirit of the West in Beach, North Dakota, Logan advanced to the

state final of the Texaco Country Showdown. There he competed against 8 contestants vying for \$1,000, and the opportunity to perform at one of the five regional competitions in the fall. The winner, a Sioux Falls, South Dakota, native received an all-expense paid trip to the National Final to compete for the \$100,000 Grand Prize and the National Title. (Continues page 3)





### **CAULIFLOWER SALAD**

1 head of cauliflower cut up  
1 cup sliced carrots  
2 cans of sliced black olives  
1-2 cups ranch dressing or to taste  
Mix all together & let sit a couple hours before serving.  
I use my homemade ranch. IT'S THE BEST!!  
These are just suggested amounts.

### **BEST EVER RANCH DRESSING**

2- TSP Accent or MSG  
¾ tsp black pepper  
1 & ½ tsp salt  
½ tsp garlic salt  
2 tsp onion salt  
2 tbsps of parsley  
Mix together with 1 quart of mayo & 3 cups of buttermilk. Make sure you use good mayo I like Best Foods the best. It gets really thin with Light or Fat free or off brands for some reason.

### **ORIENTAL SALAD**

1 lb of Chinese egg noodles ( THESE ARE HARD TO FIND" World Market", I HAVE USED SPAGHETTI)  
2 green onions diced  
2/3 cup soy sauce  
2/3 cup vegetable oil  
Cook noodles- drain good, do not rinse  
6 scrambled eggs  
Put noodles in large bowl, add soy sauce & oil, blend well and toss over noodles, add eggs & onions & toss. Shake some toasted sesame seeds and some hot seed. I like to let sit a few couple hours to blend flavors.

I BAKE THEM ON PARCHMENT PAPER FOR EASIER CLEANUP. IT WORKS GREAT TO PUT IN A CROCK POT TO KEEP WARM FOR A PARTY APPETIZER. FOR A 10 LB BAG OF WING SECTIONS, I DEFROST & POUR OFF WATER AND DOUBLE THIS RECIPE TO MARINATE THEM.


## MR AND MRS CHASE SOLBERG



The tenth meeting of the Westby Centennial organization was held on Monday, July 16, 2012 at the Westby Community Center. The meeting was called to order at 7:03 p.m. by Chair Val Moore with 17 committee members present. The secretary's report was given and approved. The treasurer's report was given and approved. Gene Kavon noted a balance of \$26136.16. Bruce Westgard inquired about the bank charges, and Gene explained the expenses were for a deposit stamp, checks, and a charge for a Canadian item.

Karen Meyer reported that Vance has been in contact with Joy Meyer and they are working on the signs.

#### Website Committee

Marlene Anderson reported on problems printing the recipes from the website for the cookbook. She has worked out a way to print them but it is a longer process.

#### Fundraising Committee

Marlene Anderson reported that the souvenirs sold on Prairie Fest day amounted to about \$1246.00. The profit on the Sliders, Carnival, and Chuck a Duck amounted to about \$3000.00 after expenses. Marlene commended Jody Bednarczyk on a job well done with the Slider Competition. Jody noted that the Westby LYO took 1<sup>st</sup> place and won the \$100.00 donated by Nemont. The Wee Bee Quilters won the best dressed award for the event. Marlene also stated that they have about 450 recipes, and would like at least 600. They will take recipes until the end of August, and then would like to begin work on the cookbook. They would like the cookbook ready to sell for Christmas. Beatie Petersen suggested taking some of the recipes from the first Westby Cookbook. Marlene stated that they need help the end of August to work on the cookbooks.

#### Registration Committee

Bruce Westgard reported that they have 210 people registered for Friday, and 232 registered for Saturday. They also have 173 registered for the continental breakfast. Bruce mentioned he has permission from Mr. Holecek of the school to use the school for registration. Elaine Onstad stated that 60-65 people had registered on Saturday during the Prairie Fest, and they will continue to encourage people to register.

#### Food Committee

Beatie Petersen reported that the Old Tractor Club will not be able to provide breakfast. Beatie asked Angel Light Catering and they will be responding to Beatie soon regarding the breakfast. Beatie will check and see if there is anyone from Crosby that is interested in serving the breakfast. She did check and there is no one interested from Williston. She checked with Plentywood about the number of vendors and they had 5. They felt that was too many, however, they have several restaurants. Beatie has 7 vendors lined up.

Marlene Anderson suggested we have a written contract with each vendor we hire signed ahead of the event. A question was brought up about charging vendors to come in to sell during the celebration. It was agreed that there isn't a need to charge anyone. Jody Lagerquist asked about electrical needs for the vendors. Beatie stated one of the vendor's trailers is 40' long. Jody will discuss these needs with Sheridan Electric.

#### Adult Entertainment Committee

Robin Solberg stated that the committee is still working on locating a large tent. She asked if there were any other uses for the tent, it was discussed that it was used in Crosby for an event and therefore recommended to our group. We may not be able to get a large tent; we may have to use some smaller tents instead. It was understood they were looking for a tent for the dances and possibly the wine tasting event. There was a question as to whether a historical home tour will be given during the celebration. Val has information from the last time there was a tour during the Prairie Fest. The group compiled history and had a list of homes in Westby. Val will get that information to Robin and Karla to work into a tour. Robin also mentioned they only have a few pictures for the power point presentation. We will be reminding people to submit pictures. Mavis Weiler suggested using several pictures that are displayed in the café. Robin stated she will talk to Lori about those pictures being used. Beatie Petersen shared that Marvel Hellegaard had suggested asking the Plentywood group if we can use their stage for the celebration. Kolby will contact Marvel to see about obtaining the stage. There is also a possibility the Sheridan County Fair board has one that could be borrowed.

#### Athletic Entertainment Committee

Sue Meyer reported that there will be a Fun Walk/Run on Saturday morning. The cost will be \$15.00 and the participant will receive a t-shirt and water. She would like participants to pre-register. Val or Sue will talk to Tracy about putting the registration on the website. Sue stated that there will be a softball game held instead of a tourney. She said the LYO will hold some kids games as well. Sue stated that she was told that the pep rally went over well in Plentywood. Sue has had people ask about Ranger gear. Some people would like to have some before the name changes this fall.

The next meeting is scheduled for Monday, August 20, 2012 at 7:00 p.m. at the Westby Community Center.




