Funeral services for Erwin D. Olson were held at 2:00 PM Saturday, March 19, with Pastor Barbara

Westhoff officiating the service at Immanuel Lutheran Church in Westby; interment, with military honors, took place in Comertown Cemetery. Casketbearers were Wade Bjorgen, David Engstrom, Gene Kavon, Bob Lagerquist, Vance Meyer, Jeff Nordhagen, and Donald Myaer; ushers were Richard E. Johnson and Lyle (Gene) Olson. American Legion members, and the Medicine Lake Honkers are recognized as Honorary Bearers. Erwin died of natural causes at his Westby home early Monday, March 14, a few hours after returning from the state basketball tourney in Bozeman; he was 83.

Born at Westby January 8, 1928, the second of five children of Ernest and Gertie (Hillstead) Olson, Erwin lived his entire life in Westby, except the two years he served in the military during the Korean War. Erwin and his siblings attended the Pleasant Valley country school northwest of Westby, riding the five miles to school each day in a small one horse cart. Erwin recalled that he and his family had to stay in the school for about a month during severe winter weather. Erwin attended Westby High School, where he developed a life-long love of basketball.

Until his death he kept up with boys basketball and would proudly show the letter sweater he earned. He graduated in 1947, and it was noted in his Senior write-up that “his favorite pastime is driving.” After graduation, he went to work for REA in Grenora and Froid, tamping poles for the new electric highline. Later that year, Erwin bought a truck and operated a dray line, hauling coal and freight from the train to businesses; also later, for a short time, hauling mail. The next year, he started the Olson Trucking Company and hauled grain and hogs until he retired around 2003.

Erwin was drafted in 1950, but because of his sister Luella’s death, he was deferred until February 1951, when he entered the Army in Butte, Montana. He was stationed at Ft. Lewis, Washington and Ft. Jackson, Arizona before going to Korea for 8 months. There he drove a supply truck until a truck accident resulted in a badly broken arm and his discharge from the military. Upon his return home, he resumed his trucking business after his arm was fully healed. He also drove school bus until 1993, covering the North Dakota area from Elkhorn Township to the radar base, Lake Skjermo, and to the Canadian border. He could have as many as thirty passengers on his bus; and ended up transporting two generations of students. He also substituted on the Daneville route. He was a driver for the Westby High School boys basketball too, transporting teams until about 1965.

From May to October, 1958-1974, Erwin also hired on as a custom combiner; first to South Dakota with the Nordhagens, then for eleven years with Richard Johnson to Oklahoma. When his father passed away in 1975, he quit custom combining to care for his mother but continued to drive truck and help local farmers with their combining.

Erwin was extremely proud of his membership in the American Legion and in 2002, he was honored with a plaque for fifty years of service. Erwin and other Korean-era vets in the area joined the American Legion Unit in Crosby, North Dakota that recognized military service in Korea as “war”. Later, when the Korean conflict was universally recognized as war-time service, he transferred his membership to the Westby Post, and remained active in Legion events until his death.

Since retirement, Erwin enjoyed checking on activities at the grain elevators and discussing crop and cattle conditions with local farmers there and at the Prairie Kitchen and Al's Meats, and participated in Senior Citizen activities. He stayed in touch with his two surviving brothers; and had an opportunity to catch a ride to the State basketball championships in Bozeman last weekend. Never married, Erwin recounted the story about a woman who tried to entice him away from Westby - that ended the relationship!

Erwin is survived by two brothers, LeRoy Olson and his wife Kathy, of Rosemount, Minnesota and Orville Olson of Great Falls, Montana and numerous nieces and nephews. His family also includes the past and present residents of the Westby community. Besides his parents, he was preceded in death by a sister, Luella, and a brother, Ralph.

As is expected, our hearts are heavy from the loss of one of our own. Erwin D. Olson, Crash, Eddy, veteran, custom combiner, LA Dodger Fan, truck driver, Westby's #1 Honker Fan, bus driver, a 15 year AA member, brother, uncle, cousin, friend, and to us, our eighty-three-year-old stepson. Yes, Olson, will be missed by one and all. One of a kind. Mind like a steel trap, but would start every conversation with a question to which he surely knew the answer better than you. The question most generally pertained to his connection to you. A couple that come to mind, which I have heard a thousand times if I've heard them once so I can only imagine how many times the subjects have heard them, "When is your birthday, Season? Ya.... Ya.... The same day as I bought my new truck." Or "You graduated in 1973 didn't you, Marsha? Ya.... Ya.... The same year as my niece, Odetta, graduated." And numbers! Telephone numbers, basketball scores, license plate numbers, county numbers, baseball scores, all tucked away to be pulled out at a moment's notice. And, if for some unknown reason, the number eluded him or he wanted to verify it, out come the trusty little red notebook. Some things just couldn't or shouldn't be messed with: short sleeved shirt with two pockets-red pen and notebook in his right, book of matches in the left (hadn't smoked for years but no sense changing now). International trucks and big cars. Olson shopped at his favorite stores-K-Market, Home of Economokey, Pi-a-mi-da, to name a few. He also, many times, had his own set of vocabulary words and used words in his own way. He told of the woman he knew who had been to Minot to get "circumcised" to quit smoking rather than hypnotized. It didn't help to correct him.

The story was the same the next time he told it. His pleasures were small-a full cup of coffee-"Ya, ya I'll take a little more." A new Timex. Anything with his name on; a medium rare steak, baked potato, and white bread. Dessert of any kind would be nice, too. He *always* said "Thank you" and was appreciative of a shared meal or any gifts he received.

They say it takes a village and, since in many ways Erwin was like a child, this certainly was the case. Erwin was very fortunate as most everyone looked out for him in one way or another. As with all kids, he could get on your nerves and you wished you could send him to his room. You may have to ask him to let someone else talk or with subtlety, mention it was time to put on a clean shirt. But again, it wasn't because you didn't love him. We are grateful to the Engstrom's for giving him the trip to the State Class C basketball tournament in Bozeman to watch his beloved Honkers. He had just returned home hours before his death and he could not have been happier. "The best trip of my life!" were his exact words.

When it is all said and done, he touched so many lives and truly had no idea how many. Things will be different now-at the elevator, the café, the post office, the store and without a doubt, our holiday dinners will never be the same.

Gone, but not forgotten-ERWIN D. OLSON.....Danny says.....

We recently managed a short trip out of town away from the horrific winter we've been experiencing. It was our first trip to Florida and pure pleasure as we spent time with dear friends and enjoyed a taste of the south. The following is a sample of the fare.

As if pound cake isn't rich enough, our host sliced, buttered and broiled this before serving. It was delicious!

CARL'S FAVORITE POUND CAKE

3 cups all purpose flour
6 eggs
3 cups sugar
1 cup sour cream
1/4 tsp baking soda
2 sticks butter (softened)
1 tbsp vanilla

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease and flour bundt or tube pan.

Cream butter and sugar, add vanilla. Add 1 cup flour and 2 eggs in three additions mixing well after each addition. Add baking soda to sour cream and stir in to mix. Pour into prepared pan and bake 1 hour 15 minutes to 1 hour 30 minutes or until toothpick inserted comes out clean.

Any leftover cake can be use in the following recipe which could easily be cut in half.

RASPBERRY MACADAMIA TRIFLE

1 pound cake (may sub angel food cake)
1-8oz cream cheese, softened
1 cup sifted powdered sugar
1/3 cup whipping cream
1 tbsp Chambord (raspberry liqueur)
1/2 tsp vanilla extract
Red food coloring, optional
12 oz fresh or frozen raspberries
Macadamia nuts, chopped
Mix the cream cheese and powdered sugar until smooth. Add cream, Chambord, vanilla and a couple drops of food coloring. Mix well. Tear cake into bite size pieces. In large clear glass bowl, layer cake pieces, raspberry cream, raspberries and nuts. Repeat layering until ingredients are gone, ending with berries and nuts. Chill several hours. Serve with additional whipped cream.
Note: Raspberry extract may be subbed for Chambord.

One thing we learned in Florida, you can't experience any part of the south without trying the grits and most food choices and restaurants chosen are by the caliber of their grits. We visited an old country store in Tallahassee best known for their smoked country sausage and country milled grits, both of which traveled home with us. The following is the first recipe I tried as a "southern cook". I'm beginning to think they are on to something.....

LEMON-GARLIC SHRIMP AND GRITS

3/4 cup instant grits
Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper
1/4 cup grated parmesan cheese
3 tablespoons unsalted butter
1 1/4 pounds medium shrimp, peeled and deveined, tails intact
2 large cloves garlic, minced
Pinch of cayenne pepper (optional)
Juice of 1/2 lemon, plus wedges for serving
2 tablespoons roughly chopped fresh parsley
Bring 3 cups of water to a boil in a medium saucepan over high heat, covered. Uncover and slowly whisk in the grits, 1 teaspoon salt and 1/2 teaspoon pepper. Reduce the heat to medium low and cook, stirring occasionally, until thickened, about 5 minutes. Stir in the parmesan and 1 tablespoon butter. Remove from the heat and season with salt and pepper. Cover to keep warm. Meanwhile, season the shrimp with salt and pepper. Melt the remaining 2 tablespoons butter in a large skillet over medium-high heat. Add the shrimp, garlic and cayenne, if using, and cook, tossing, until the shrimp are pink, 3 to 4 minutes. Remove from the heat and add 2 tablespoons water, the lemon juice and parsley; stir to coat the shrimp with the sauce and season with salt and pepper. Divide the grits among shallow bowls and top with the shrimp and sauce. Serve with lemon wedges. Serves 4.

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Trustees of Westby School District #3 was held on February 9, 2011. Brenda Ryals, Vance Meyer, Marty Westgard, Aldon Joyes, Mr. Holecek, Mr. Somppi, Arlene Hove and Donna Sorenson were in attendance. Chairman Ryals called the meeting to order at 7:03 p.m. Board member Jim Sundsted arrived at 7:06 p.m.

There were no visitors at the meeting.

The tentative agenda was reviewed. One announcement item was added, followed by a motion by Westgard to approve, seconded by Joyes, AIF.

Arlene read the minutes of the January 10, 2011 meeting. Following no corrections or additions, these minutes were approved and placed on file.

The Board reviewed the Clerk's December financial report.

There was no public comment.

Committee Reports:

Buildings & Grounds: Mr. Holecek informed the board that negotiations for the two lots on 2nd Avenue were successful. The school will purchase these two 50' W X 140' L lots from The Westby Development Corp. for a total of \$4,000.00. O'Toole Law firm in Plentywood will draw up the appropriate documents to facilitate this purchase and will have them recorded with the Sheridan County Clerk and Recorder when the proper signatures have been obtained. Mr. Holecek presented several housing options for the board to consider when requesting bids for the construction of the home to be placed on these lots. He would like to look into the possibility of hiring a general contractor to oversee all aspects of the construction and bid processes. The board recommended a couple of possible contractors for Mr. Holecek to contact.

Mr. Holecek updated the board on the status of the projects yet to be completed by Mon-Dak Heating and Ebel Integrators.

Unfinished Business:

A. Revised Policy BP 2221P (School Closure) was given a second reading. Meyer made a motion to approve this revision, Westgard seconded, AIF.

New Business:

A. Mr. Holecek reported that Shaine Andersen and T.J. Smith have both requested to be added to the school's substitute teacher list. Sundsted made a motion to add these individuals, seconded by Meyer, AIF.

B. Mr. Holecek presented information from MSGIA regarding a Two Year Rate Commitment Guarantee. This commitment would guarantee that our property insurance premium would not increase for a two year period beginning July 1, 2011. Westgard moved to make this commitment, Joyes seconded, AIF.

C. At Mr. Holecek's request Mrs. Hove updated the board on the need to hire a new school auditor. Meyer made a motion to contract with Olness and Associates, PC to serve as the school auditor for the next three years. Westgard seconded the motion and all voted in favor.

D. Mr. Holecek reported that there are 3 rooms scheduled to have new carpets installed this summer. Be Alert for Scams

Nemont strongly urges consumers to be on the alert for telephone calls and e-mails that lead to a scam.

Consumers occasionally receive calls or e-mails claiming they have won valuable prizes or large sums of money, or they receive a message from an unknown caller stating a family member is in distress and they need money right away. Consumers are then instructed to call a number which appears to be a regular telephone number; it is not. Be aware that these scammers are usually looking for you to send them money.

Aside from the actual scam to fool people into sending money, people who call to inquire about the prize or relative may also end up paying for an expensive phone call. While toll-free numbers begin with "8," the area code to locations such as Jamaica or the Dominican Republic also begin with "8," which mistakenly gives the impression they are toll-free 800 numbers. Calls to locations in the Caribbean are not toll-free.

When in doubt, refer to the Area Code page in the front pages of your Nemont directory.

If the area code does not correspond to one of the 50 American states, you will be charged a higher rate for the call.

Toll-free numbers begin with these prefixes only: 888, 877, 866, 855 or 800. If the number you are dialing does not begin with one of these prefixes, you will be charged for the call.

Although it has been mentioned the intent is to restore it to its original purpose which was grazing, interest in the property has also been shown by an oil company and a gravel crushing business. Either of which, could be viable options. Whatever the outcome, those of us who have witnessed the deterioration of the site are happy to see things move forward as The Fortuna Radar Base still holds many memories, not only for the many men and women who served there, but also for the natives whose lives were touched in some way by these people and their "home away from home" here to serve their country.
