



This recipe featuring the ever popular spring rhubarb stalk is one of many in the new Westby Centennial cookbook. Marlene Andersen made it famous with her Rhubarb milkshakes at Prairie Fest and sundaes served at the Sizzlin' Summer Steak Frys.

RHUBARB SAUCE TOPPING

4 CUPS RHUBARB

1 CUP WATER

1 CUP SUGAR

1 (3 OZ) PKG JELLO

Cook, rhubarb, water and sugar until rhubarb is soft and sauce has thickened. Remove from heat and stir in the strawberry Jell-O until completely dissolved. Let cool to lukewarm. Serve warm over ice cream or use to make rhubarb milk shakes.

Quick dessert: Scoop ice cream into balls and roll in shredded coconut, return to freezer on a tray.

To serve, place ball in serving bowl and spoon warm sauce over ice cream ball.

I served these individual cheesecakes for a small group of ladies following an early spring luncheon. I thought them outstanding! I thoroughly enjoy goat cheese and in this recipe it is just the right touch to make the cheesecake not too sweet and not too rich. Be sure to use a good quality goat cheese as the flavor can vary tremendously from one brand to another.

LEMON, POPPY AND CHÈVRE CHEESECAKES WITH RHUBARB COMPOTE

1/4 cup plus 2 tablespoons sugar, plus more for coating the ramekins
8 ounces cream cheese, at room temperature
6 ounces soft fresh goat cheese, at room temperature
2 teaspoons finely grated lemon zest
1 teaspoon fresh lemon juice
1/2 teaspoon vanilla bean paste or 1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract
1/4 teaspoon salt
1 cup sour cream
3 large eggs, at room temperature
1 tablespoon poppy seeds

COMPOTE

1 pound rhubarb, cut into 1/2-inch dice
1/2 cup sugar
1/2 vanilla bean, split
Pinch of salt
1 teaspoon finely grated orange zest
1 teaspoon finely grated fresh ginger
1 tablespoon St.-Germain liqueur or elderflower cordial (1 subbed Grand Marnier or even orange juice will work)
1 pint raspberries

STREUSEL

5 tablespoons unsalted butter, at room temperature
1/4 cup plus 2 tablespoons sugar
1/2 teaspoon fresh lemon juice
1 cup graham cracker crumbs (from 1 sleeve)
1 teaspoon all-purpose flour
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon cinnamon



MAKE THE CHEESECAKES

Preheat the oven to 325°. Spray eight 4- to 6-ounce ramekins with vegetable oil spray and dust with sugar; tap out the excess. Set the ramekins in a large roasting pan. In a large bowl, using an electric mixer, beat the cream cheese, goat cheese and the 1/4 cup plus 2 tablespoons of sugar until smooth. Beat in the zest, lemon juice, vanilla and salt. Beat in the sour cream. Add the eggs, one at a time, beating well between additions. Beat in the poppy seeds. Divide the mixture between the ramekins and set the pan in the oven. Carefully add enough hot water to the pan to reach halfway up the sides of the ramekins. Bake for 20 to 25 minutes, until the cheesecakes are just set. Remove from the oven and let cool in the water bath for 1 hour. Refrigerate the cheesecakes until cooled completely, 3 hours.

MEANWHILE, MAKE THE COMPOTE

In a medium saucepan, let the rhubarb, sugar, vanilla bean and salt stand until slightly juicy, 20 minutes. Add the zest and ginger and cook over moderate heat, stirring occasionally, until the rhubarb is tender, about 15 minutes. Add the St.-Germain and raspberries and cook until slightly thickened, about 5 minutes. Transfer the compote to a bowl and let cool. Discard the vanilla bean.

MAKE THE STREUSEL

Preheat the oven to 350°. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper. In a bowl, using an electric mixer, beat the butter, sugar and lemon juice until fluffy. Beat in the graham cracker crumbs, flour, salt and cinnamon. Scatter the streusel onto the baking sheet and freeze for 10 minutes. Bake the streusel for about 20 minutes, until fragrant, golden and firm. Let cool completely, then crumble the streusel. Run a thin knife around the cheesecakes and invert them onto plates. Spoon the compote on top and garnish with the streusel crumbs. Serve right away.

Heather's Grandma Pearl came through with another winning recipe. It is cool and refreshing and sounds perfect for spring.

PEARL'S CREAMY COCONUT CAKE

1 pkg white cake mix
1 ½ cups milk
½ cup sugar
2 cups coconut
8 oz whipped topping, thawed
Prepare cake mix as directed, bake in 9X13 pan.
Cool 15 minutes. Poke holes throughout cake with utility fork. Meanwhile combine milk; sugar and ½ cup of the coconut. Bring to a boil, reduce heat and simmer one minute. Carefully spoon mixture over cake. Cool completely. Fold ½ cup coconut in to whipped topping and spread over cake. Sprinkle with remaining coconut. Cover and chill overnight.





Centennial Radio Report

KATQ Radio in Plentywood is featuring a weekly history spot in honor of the 2013 Westby Centennial.

The spots are written by Jandy Jorgensen and Jandy, along with a variety of Westby residents, will read the brief histories which air Tuesdays at 10:10 am (1070 AM and 100.1 FM).

Good day from Westby Montana - the little town with the big heart - hosting its centennial celebration this summer on July 12 – 14, 2013! This is Jandy (graduate of WHS with the dynamic class of 1984) with a little story of the century old famous NE MT town!

Last time I shared with you a little bit about the homesteaders and squatters of the Westby area and the hardships they endured, but the bravery that was shown must have kept their spirits alive to persevere. To give you a glimpse of how trying those times were, I snatched a story from Rick Petersen's grandparents: PC and Mette Petersen. Their first order of business back in 1908 was to put up a sod barn using the lumber brought for the house instead for the barn roof. Horse blankets were hung as partitions to allow the horses, cows and chickens to inhabit one end and allow Mette to cook and her and the family to eat in the other end

. A neighbor, Carl Buck Jensen, had acquired a 10X10 shack from one who had already tired of the "Wild West" and high tailed it out. Jensen loaned it to P.C. and his family to sleep in. The first night in the shack a thunderstorm came up. It wasn't long before the tar paper roof had blown off and P.C. and Mette were both ankle deep in water, each holding a son. By this time, P.C. was wishing he had never heard of Montana and, one can imagine, this would not be the last time he wished those thoughts.

The second part of the little history lesson had to do with another group of Danes in the northwestern corner of ND who decided to start a town there in 1909. An application was made for the post office to be called "Westby". This name was chosen because the word "By" in Danish means "town" and it would be the most westerly town in ND; thus, it was named West Town or Westby (in Danish). The application was granted and James Hansen became the first postmaster. Ed Simonson drove the first star route between Ambrose, Skjermo, and later to Westby. The nearest ND town was Ambrose, some 25 miles to the east.

In this ND town of Westby, Mr. J P Neve set up a blacksmith shop, Nels Nelson agreed to build a store and Oliver Sannerud was sent out to operate that store. The first lumber yard and a bank were started by Harold Borg. Jacob Freund ran a feed barn, and so the town of early Westby, ND had what it needed for only a couple of years ... *(Continues next page)*

until the rumor that the Soo Line would probably extend their rails westward from Ambrose to the ND/MT border! This caused a flurry of excitement, and when the railroad was finally assured, the ND town of Westby was picked up and moved 3 miles northwest to the ND line to wait for the long dreamed of rail. (A city on the railroad was big time in those days!) Daneville Cemetery is now all that remains of the vicinity of the old Westby townsite. Can you imagine what it was like to move buildings, barns and some houses a mere three miles back in those days!

When large buildings like the Nelson-Sannerud Store were moved the 3 miles from ND to the present location, a large steam engine was brought in which pulled the building over a series of round poles used as rollers. These rollers were manned by a dozen strong men who kept carrying the rollers to the front from the back as the building passed over them.

There was a bit of controversy when it came time for the railroad to plot the town, however. The site on the ND side of the border was ignored as it seems that the railroad rates for MT were higher than those in ND, and so with finances and income on the chopping block, officials placed the new townsite on the Montana side of the state line.

So, the business section was completely abandoned at the southern ND site and in 1914 the town was finally moved mostly into MT. Remember, this was also during the days of Prohibition in ND, so the saloons were located on the Montana soil. This, as one comment reads, "split the town with the business 'improper' on one side of the line and the business 'proper' on the other side." Makes me smile now knowing that there were saloons on both sides of the current main street up until a few years ago. Was that to make businesses even out so no one side of Westby was more "improper" than the other?



Edwin Carl Fransen was born on Nov. 19, 1920 in Plentywood, MT. His parents Oscar Fransen and Anne(Jensen) Fransen were Scandinavian immigrants. Edwin was one of four children including Esther, Edith and John.

After graduating from Coolidge School, he worked on his father's farm and later took over for his ailing father. Farming was his life's work. Someone once suggested to him that he should get a hobby, but he said I have a hobby---farming!

On June 4, 1944 he married Dorothy Hass. She was the cherished love of his life and they were seldom apart throughout the nearly 69 years of their marriage.

Edwin's career as a farmer spanned nearly eight decades until he retired and moved to Plentywood. He turned the farming operation over to Brian Tommerup, but the farm remains in the Fransen family as it has for the past 103 years.

Edwin passed away May 13, 2013, age 92, at the Billings Health & Rehab Center.



He is survived by his sister Edith Haarstad (Kalmer -deceased)-Minot; wife Dorothy -Billings; children Dennis (Cheryl) Billings; James(Jan) Bellingham, WA; Debra Goodheart (Chuck-deceased) -Billings; several paternal and step grandchildren and great grandchildren as well as nieces and neph-







MEMORIAL DAY PROGRAM


