It's official. Westby Centennial 2013 has been set for **July 12th, 13th and 14th, 2013.**

An organizational meeting was held on August 30th to kick-start the upcoming city centennial with 28 enthusiastic and committed people in attendance. Mayor Jim Weiler opened the meeting with important factors in organizing a centennial celebration. He announced the city would donate \$5,000.00 to get the Centennial off the ground and called for a chairman for the event. After some discussion, Val Moore and Leann Westgard agreed to co-chair. Other officers elected were Brenda Ryals, secretary, and Gene Kavon as treasurer. Several committee chairs were put in place, also, with fundraising, publicity, and logo taking precedent.

Marlene Anderson agreed to chair the fundraising committee. It was reported, the other communities in Sheridan County, who held centennials this past

summer, were able to pull them off without a registration fee. Our group would like to follow suit, if possible. These communities received many donations from alumni and other organizations and used all funds generated from the sale of memorabilia. Because most of the funds from memorabilia will not be realized until the centennial, fundraising will have to begin immediately to cover expenses.

Vance Meyer will head up the logo department. A \$100.00 prize will be awarded to the person who comes up with the most fitting Centennial logo.

Val Moore and Tracy Johanson will work through *the Border News* and the other newspapers in the area, as well as the radio station, on publicity.

The next meeting has been set for November 15th, 2010, at the Community Center, 7:00 PM. Many more volunteers are needed to round out the committees and a few committee chairmen are yet to be filled. See the new "Centennial" column for further information.

Culture, it is what defines us and separates us from the rest. With the centennial in our spotlight, it's a good time to see just what we *are* made of. From the planning to the implementing of an event of this magnitude, it is a great way to remember, or learn, and pass on the history to the next generation and hopefully along the way have some laughs, make a new friend, or get reacquainted with an old one. It is a huge undertaking, no one will argue that point, but anyone who spent any time on Main Street during the Prairie Fest can attest to the fact, those returning "home" for the event are appreciative and very happy to be back. Yes, they miss out on the work, but they also miss out on the camaraderie, the excitement and anticipation that develops over time. It was great to have so many at the organizational meeting and I know many, many more will be on board before it is all said and done. I really can't imagine anyone not wanting to be involved on some level because, not only is it fun, it is about us, for us! I like to think of it in terms of planning a huge gathering and you all know how I like to gather. I do believe, though, I will leave the cooking for this one to someone else!

Speaking of gatherings and culture, I celebrated a birthday this past week (they are coming way, way too fast) and gathered a few, for the occasion, with the menu featuring a little Mexican cuisine.

I centered the meal around quesadillas because they are so adaptable to individual tastes'. The recipes I chose for this particular evening may have been little grown up for kids, but that is the beauty of the quesadilla idea, you can add, change, or delete any filling item you choose. Chop a few fresh veggies: red, yellow, green peppers, mushrooms, and onions; offer a couple kinds of cooked meats: chicken, ham; and plenty of cheese; lay out a stack of tortillas and start to assemble. Cover one-half of the tortilla with the fillings of your choice, fold over, brush with butter or spray with cooking spray and fry until golden brown on both sides. It is great menu to get the kids involved with.

My birthday quesadillas:

PEPPER JACK, CHICKEN AND PEACH QUESADILLAS

- 1 teaspoon honey
- 1/2 teaspoon fresh lime juice
- 1/2 cup reduced-fat sour cream
- 4 (8-inch) flour tortillas
- 3/4 cup (3 ounces) shredded Monterey Jack cheese with jalapeño peppers
- 1 cup chopped skinless, boneless rotisserie chicken breast
- 1 cup thinly sliced peeled firm ripe peaches
- 4 teaspoons chopped fresh cilantro
- Cooking spray

Combine honey and lime juice in a small bowl, stirring well with a whisk. Stir sour cream into honey mixture; cover and chill until ready to serve. Place tortillas flat on a work surface. Sprinkle 3 tablespoons cheese over half of each tortilla; top each tortilla with 1/4 cup chicken, 1/4 cup peaches, and 1 teaspoon cilantro. Fold tortillas in half. Heat a large non-stick skillet over medium-high heat. Coat pan with cooking spray. Place 2 quesadillas in the pan, and top quesadillas with a cast-iron or other heavy skillet. Cook 1 1/2 minutes on each side or until tortillas are crisp and lightly browned (leave cast-iron skillet on quesadillas as they cook). Remove quesadillas from pan; set aside, and keep warm. Repeat procedure with the remaining quesadillas. Cut each quesadilla into wedges. Serve with sauce

SMOKED SALMON AND APPLE QUESADILLAS w/ HORSERADISH SAUCE

Quesadillas

8 ozs thinly sliced smoked salmon
1 small Granny Smith apple, cored and julienned
8 ozs Monterey Jack cheese, grated
¼ cup Asiago cheese
1 tbsp fresh dill, chopped
3 tbsp finely diced red onion
1 tsp fresh lime juice
4 flour tortillas at room temperature
2 tbsp butter, melted

Horseradish Sauce

2 tbsp prepared horseradish
2 tbsp chopped chives
½ cup sour cream
½ cup mayonnaise
3 tbsp heavy cream
1 tbsp lemon juice
1 tsp salt

Whisk horseradish and remaining sauce ingredients in bowl.

In a large bowl, mix salmon, apple, cheeses, dill, onion and lime juice together. Spread ¼ of the mixture over half of each tortilla. Fold tortillas over to form a half circle. Heat a large non-stick pan over med heat. Brush one side of each tortilla with butter. Place buttered side down in heated pan. Cook 3-4 minutes or until golden brown. Brush top with butter. Turn over and cook another 3-4 minutes. Cut each quesadilla into 3 wedges. Serve warm with horseradish crème. Serves 4 for meal or 8 for appetizers.

Try the quesadillas with this bean salad. The fabulous cilantro-based dressing that coats this salad with bright, fresh flavor and just a touch of heat will fool your taste buds into thinking spring.

GARBANZO and BLACK BEAN SALAD

Dressing

½ cup coarsely chopped cilantro
2 green onions, coarsely chopped
3 tbsp lime juice
1 small Serrano chile, seeded, deveined, coarsely chopped
1 tsp honey
½ tsp grated lime peel
½ tsp salt
¼ tsp pepper
2 tbsp olive oil

Salad

1 (15 oz) can garbanzo beans, drained & rinsed
1 (15 oz) can black beans, drained, rinsed
2 cups coarsely chopped tomatoes
1 med cucumber, peeled, seeded, coarsely chopped (1 ½ cups)
½ cup chopped red onion
½ cup coarsely chopped cilantro
1 green onion, sliced

Blend all dressing ingredients except oil in blender 1 minute or until smooth.

With motor running, add oil in thin stream until blended.

Combine all salad ingredients in large bowl. Add dressing, toss to coat. Cover and refrigerate 30 minutes before serving. 8 servings

SCHOOL BOARD MEETING MINUTES

Regular Meeting
August 16, 2010
7:00 P.M.

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Trustees of Westby School District #3 was held on August 16, 2010. Brenda Ryals, Vance Meyer, Marty Westgard, Mr. Holecek and Arlene Hove were in attendance. Chairman Ryals called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

The Chairman recognized the visitors, Mr. Koterba and Suzi Ekness.

The tentative agenda was reviewed followed by a motion by Meyer to approve, seconded by Westgard, AIF.

Arlene read the minutes of the July 26, 2010 special meeting. Following no corrections or additions, these minutes were approved and placed on file.

The annual Trustee's Report, as prepared by Mrs. Hove, was available for review.

Public Comment: None

Committee Reports: **Buildings & Grounds:** Mr. Holecek reported on the HVAC project. The twelve classrooms in the west wing are operational as of today. The cafeteria and music room units will be operating by Friday. The flooring in the locker rooms will be installed next spring. The exterior doors in the cafeteria and kitchen should be installed soon. Concern was expressed regarding the window wells at the new teacher residence – shoveling the snow out of them or covering them should help.

Unfinished Business:

New Business:

A. The Westby School Student Handbook was presented and it was noted that it was updated in 2009 with assistance from the MHSA. Westgard moved to approve this handbook with no changes, Meyer seconded, AIF. The handbook will be reviewed again in the spring.

B. The Westby School Staff Handbook was also updated in 2009. Westgard moved to approve with no changes, Meyer seconded, AIF.

C. The budget for fiscal year 2011 was reviewed. Mr. Koterba explained the proposed budgets followed by a motion by Westgard to adopt the FY '11 Budgets, Meyer seconded, AIF.

D. The 2010/11 class schedule was reviewed. Meyer moved to accept this schedule, Westgard seconded, AIF.

E. Meyer moved to offer Cathy Nordhagen a contract for the volleyball co-op bus driver, Westgard seconded, AIF.

Westgard moved to offer Marilyn Elm a contract for the football van driver, Meyer seconded, AIF. Ryals moved to offer Lisa Schipman a contract as the second football van driver, Westgard seconded, AIF.

F. The substitute teacher list was reviewed followed by a motion by Westgard to approve, Meyer seconded, AIF.

G. The Board reviewed a proposal from Arlene Hove regarding her intent to retire as District Clerk approximately one year from now. Ryals moved to accept this proposal, Meyer seconded, AIF. The position will be advertised, seeking a Deputy Clerk to train with Arlene for the next year.

H. Mr. Holecek recommended hiring Chad Solberg as Head Boys' Basketball Coach for the 2010/11 season. Meyer moved to hire Chad Solberg, Westgard seconded the motion for hire, AIF.

I. The additional bid request from Ebel Integrators for magnetic locks for the East door of \$2,596.78 and a security camera in the Shop for \$1,089.95 were reviewed. Westgard moved to purchase this additional equipment, Meyer seconded, AIF.

J. Ryals read a letter of resignation from Donna Sorenson, effective as of the August 16, 2010 Board meeting. Mrs. Sorenson has served as a Westby School Board Trustee for the past nine years. Westgard moved to accept this resignation, Ryals seconded, AIF. The Board will appoint a new member at the September meeting to fulfill the remainder of this term.

Announcements/Discussion

A. Extracurricular vacancies are Assistant Boys' Basketball Coach, 7th & 8th Boys' & Girls' basketball and 3rd-6th Boys' & Girls' basketball coaching positions.

B. Mr. Holecek reviewed the 2009/10 AYP report. He noted that Westby Elementary scored 89%; Grades 7 & 8 scored 88%; Westby High School scored 95%. He also explained the scoring process and how that will change again next year

C. Mr. Holecek reported that all six buses passed inspection on August 16, 2010.

D. The school staff picnic is Friday August 20, 2010.

E. Mr. Holecek noted some route changes which have been forwarded to the County Superintendent.

F. A thank you from Audrey Anderson was read, thanking the Board for the use of the school during the school reunions in July.

Ryals moved to approve payment of August payroll warrants #10624-10632 totaling \$22,966.11, and August claims Warrants #15826-15863 totaling \$198,382.45. Westgard seconded the motion for payment approval, AIF.

The June Extracurricular Financial Report was reviewed followed by a motion by Meyer to approve, Westgard seconded the motion, AIF.
